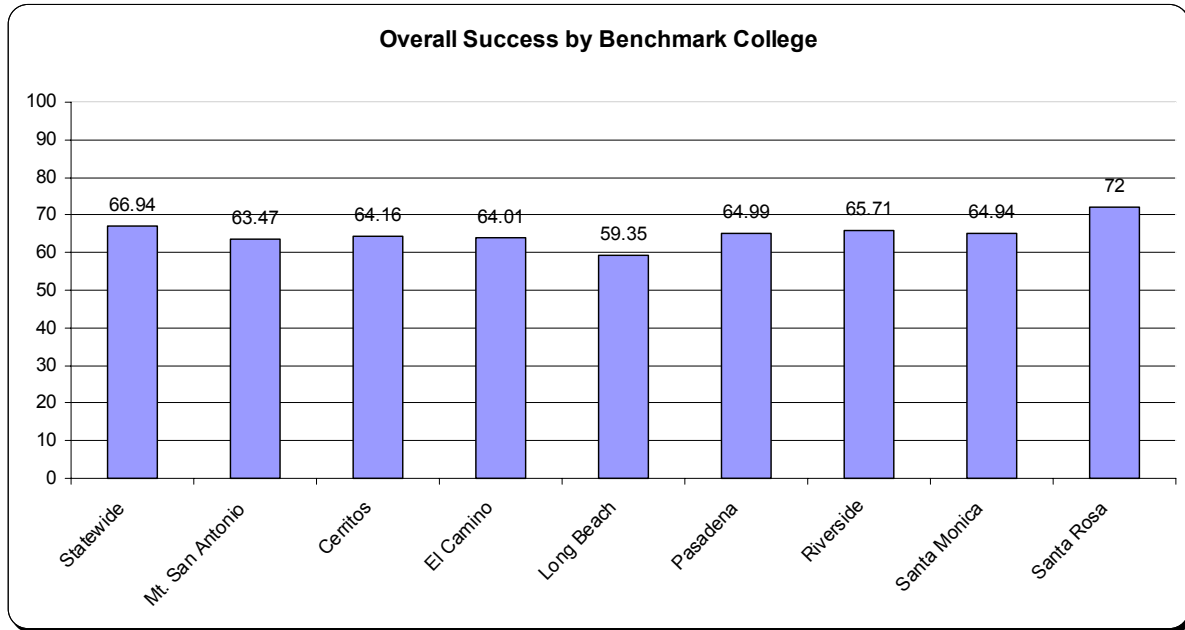


**Mt. San Antonio College
Success Comparison by Ethnicity
Spring 2007**

Success refers to the percentage of students who receive a grade of 'C' or better (or CR) in the course.

Overall, in Spring 2007, Mt. SAC had a comparable success rate to the other benchmark colleges.

In terms of ethnicity, African-Americans were more successful at Mt. SAC than at most of the other benchmark colleges. Asians attending Mt. SAC were more successful than at Long Beach.
