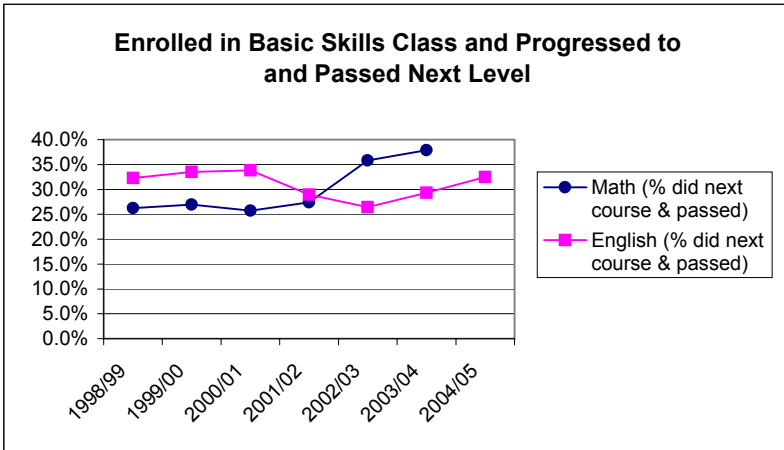

Definition: Transfer Prepared--The net number of students who earned, within a six-year period, 56 transferable units with a minimum GPA of 2.00. Net number of students means that a student reaching transfer prepared status in a prior academic year and is still enrolled is not counted during the current academic year.

Definition: Basic Skills--To be counted as "improved" a student must have enrolled in a basic skills course. Then in a subsequent term, they must enroll in a course with a program code in the same group but which is at a higher level. The higher course must have been completed with a grade of "C" or better. A student may be counted twice, once in mathematics and once in English if they improve in both.
