## Degree and Certificate-Related Employment For the Vocational Graduates of 2001-02

The purpose of this report is to determine, six to eight months after graduation, the employment status of Mt. San Antonio College's 2001-02 vocational program graduates in relationship to the degrees and certificates that they received. The intent is to get a more specific picture of the employment outcomes for those who hold these degrees and certificates, and to begin an ongoing history of employment outcomes that could be used by career education departments during program review.

In January of 2003, Career Placement Services (CPS) conducted a broad survey of the 2001-02 A.S. Degree and Career Certificate recipients to gather data concerning: a) the number of graduates who were employed, b) their starting salaries, c) percentages of A.S. Degrees and Career Certificates connected to graduates employed in positions related to their respective degrees/certificates, d) the importance of vocational education programs in preparing graduates for related employment, and e) percentages of vocational program graduates continuing their college education. Results of the data gathered for all of the above items, except for item 'c', are presented in the McNeice-Stallard and Woodyard (2003) Alumni Survey <http://research.mtsac.edu/pdf/insights/insightsv13n3.pdf> wherein the results of the CPS survey are combined with the results of an Office of Research and Institutional Effectiveness survey of 2001-02 Mt. SAC A.A. Degree recipients.

The focus of this report is to present the program-specific findings for item 'c', which identifies the percentages of A.S. Degrees and Career Certificates connected to graduates who are employed in positions related to their respective degrees/certificates (awards). Some might refer to this more commonly as the "placement rate" for individual vocational programs. It is important to note that the focus of this effort was to gather and report facts. There is no attempt made to measure the value or effectiveness of any instructional program from the data presented.

## ***Methodology***

In January 2003, all individuals who obtained an A.S. Degree or Career Certificate from Mt. SAC in 2001-02 (total of 829 people) were sent a questionnaire by mail. A total of 169 individuals completed their questionnaires and mailed them back to CPS. A follow-up effort was conducted in March of 2003, in which Career Placement Services called all of those who had not yet returned their questionnaires. Most of those who were contacted through this effort agreed to be surveyed by phone, resulting in an additional 357 completed questionnaires. The end result—526 surveys were collected—a response rate of 63.4% (526/829).

Each questionnaire contained a unique code number, which made it possible to identify the A.S. Degree and/or Career Certificate earned by each respondent. This allowed for the grouping of employment outcome data by degree or certificate (See Appendix B).

The survey questions used specifically to compile employment outcome data for this report are listed below:

- Are you a continuing college student enrolled in classes at a college or university? (Question #2)
- Are you planning on using your Associate Degree or Certificate to find work while you continue your studies? (Question #3)
- Are you currently employed? (Question #4)
- If you are employed, is your job related to your Mt. SAC Associate Degree or Certificate? (Question #7)
- What is your job title? (Question #8)

Appendix A contains the full survey. Data collected concerning other items such as salaries (Question #10) and importance of education in preparation for the job (Question #11) are included in the McNeice-Stallard and Woodyard (2003) Alumni Survey that can be accessed at <http://research.mtsac.edu/pdf/insights/insightsv13n3.pdf>.

Employment and unemployment information from 57 of the 526 completed surveys was excluded from the reports that follow. It was determined that these respondents were not members of the group of graduates who were the intended target of this study. For more information about the excluded responses, please see the note at the end of Appendix B.

## ***Limitations***

Although CPS sent a survey to every student who received a vocational degree or certificate, it should be noted that in most cases, certificates and degrees were only awarded to qualified students who requested them. It is likely therefore, that some individuals who qualified for a degree or certificate were not surveyed because they did not request and receive their degree/certificate. These individuals would not have been identified in the ICCIS query that produced the list of graduates to be surveyed.

It is also important to note that some vocational programs had from one to only a few individuals who received a particular A.S. Degree or Career Certificate. For these, as well

as some other programs with more graduates but poor response rates, there were only one or two respondents. In these instances, the reader should be careful not to infer much from the data, as there isn't enough information with which to gain a reasonable sense of graduate employment success. For example, it takes just two successful placements to show a 100% employment rate in a certificate program represented by only two respondents. The converse is also true, which could give the unfair impression of a poor employment outlook for anyone enrolled in that particular program simply because two respondents had difficulty finding jobs.

Obviously, the greater the number of graduates and responses, the more meaningful the data becomes. Nevertheless, even two responses in a particular category each year can be useful if a trend becomes apparent over a three-year period or longer. Because this is the first survey of its kind, the value of the attached reports is limited for certain degrees and certificates with small numbers of graduates/respondents. Additional surveys concerning 2002-03 and 2003-04 graduates should increase the usefulness of the data for these particular certificates and degrees as a history of outcomes is established.

## **Results**

The following is a general overview of the findings. The employment responses for individual certificate and A.S. Degree programs are included in Appendices B and C respectively. A primary purpose of this report is to convey employment outcome data for each certificate and degree. Therefore, the employment numbers and percentages in this report are presented in relationship to the certificates and degrees awarded, rather than in reference to individual graduates. For example: The survey found that 259 Career Certificates and 180 Associate of Science Degrees (439 total awards) were connected to employment through the graduates who had earned them. However, the 439 total awards do not represent 439 graduates, because in several cases one person accounted for more than one of those awards—such as one individual having earned two certificates or a certificate and an A.S. Degree from the same program. Therefore, whenever a student, who had received more than one award in 2001-02, reported having obtained one job that was related to both awards, then each award was credited with a hire in their respective tables (Appendices B & C). On the other hand, if the job was related to one of the awards and not the other, the appropriate award was credited with a hire and the other wasn't.

### ***Employment-Status Responses for All Awards***

The overall employment rate for graduates with an A.S. Degree or certificate in any type of employment is 83.1%. In terms of award specific employment data, there are a total of 515 degrees and certificates (awards) in this survey for which employment/unemployment outcomes are reported (Table 1). Those outcomes that were positive for employment were then further identified as either training related (degree or certificate related employment) or unrelated (employment not related to the specific award). Of the 515 awards, 328 (63.7%) were connected to graduates in training-related employment. An additional 111 awards (21.5) were connected to graduates with jobs that were unrelated to their specific degree/certificate. The total number of awards connected to graduates

employed in any field is 439, which is 85.2% of all awards reported. Those awards that are connected to graduates who were unemployed at the time of the survey are numbered under the table heading of 'Not Connected to Employment'.

### ***Employment-Status Responses for Awards by Division***

Within the Business Division, employment-status responses were received for 163 awards (Table 2). Of these, 132 awards (81%) were connected with a positive-employment status. Eighty-three (51%) were connected to jobs related to the graduates' specific degrees/certificates.

Technology and Health had the greatest number of responses with 284 awards reporting employment/unemployment outcomes (Table 3). Of these, 248 (87.3) were connected with a positive-employment status, and 196 (69%) were connected to degree/certificate related employment.

Natural Sciences was represented by employment/unemployment responses for 51 vocational certificates/degrees (Table 4). Forty-four awards (86.3%) were connected with a positive-employment status, and 39 (76.5%) were connected to employment related to the earned award.

Humanities and Social Sciences has far fewer vocational programs within the Division. Therefore, there were fewer graduates with vocational degrees/certificates. The Division is represented by employment-status responses for 15 earned awards (Table 5). Thirteen (86.7%) were connected to a positive-employment status and eight (53.3%) were connected to training-related jobs.

The Physical Education Division offers the fewest vocational awards, and the survey evoked only two employment-status responses (Table 6). Both of these had a positive-employment status and were connected to training-related jobs. There were no A.S. Degrees awarded in the Physical Education Division in 2001-02.

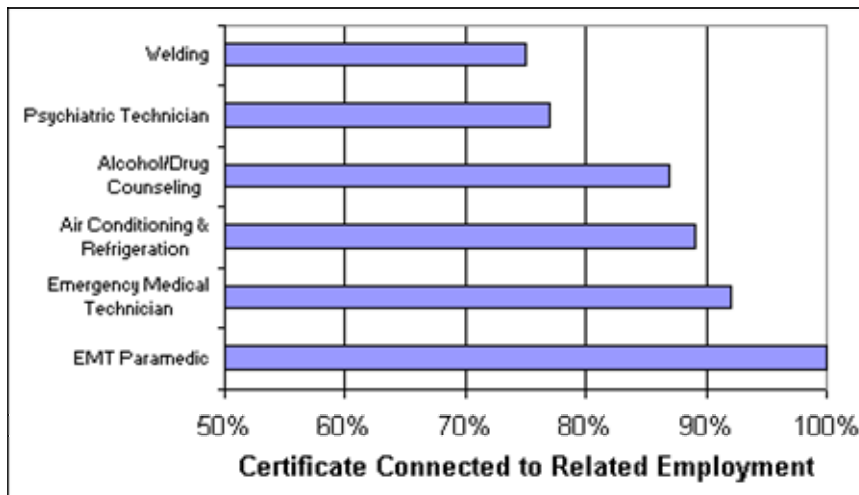
Reported employment outcomes for specific certificates are presented in Appendix B, by division and certificate. If a particular certificate had at least one recipient in 2001-02, it was included here.

Employment/unemployment responses were received for a total of 307 Career Certificates in this report. Within this group, a total of 198 positive-employment outcomes were certificate related (Table 1), representing a combined certificate-related employment percentage of 64.5%. If all 259 positive-employment responses are counted, whether certificate related or not, there is an 84.4% combined employment rate for all certificate programs.

Certificates with particularly impressive training-related employment responses are listed below (Chart 1). These are certificates from Appendix B for which there were a minimum of seven employment-status responses, with at least 70% of the responses identifying certificate-related employment (CRE).

- EMT Paramedic – 14 respondents, **100% CRE**
- Emergency Medical Tech 1 – 13 respondents, **92% CRE**
- Air Conditioning & Refrigeration – 9 respondents, **89% CRE**
- Alcohol/Drug Counseling – 15 respondents, **87% CRE**
- Psychiatric Technician – 31 respondents, **77% CRE**
- Welding – 8 respondents, **75% CRE**

Several other certificate categories had high certificate-related employment percentages, but had too few employment-status responses for reasonable inferences. It should also be noted that reasonable inferences cannot be made with regard to certificates with low certificate-related employment percentages (Appendix B) when only a few employment-status responses are received. However – assuming that this survey is repeated for the classes of 2003 and 2004 – a compilation of three years of survey data could be very useful concerning degree or certificate programs that are represented by only a few respondents each year. If a consistent trend becomes apparent, even a few responses may lead to reasonable inferences.

## **Employment-Status Responses for A.S. Degrees**

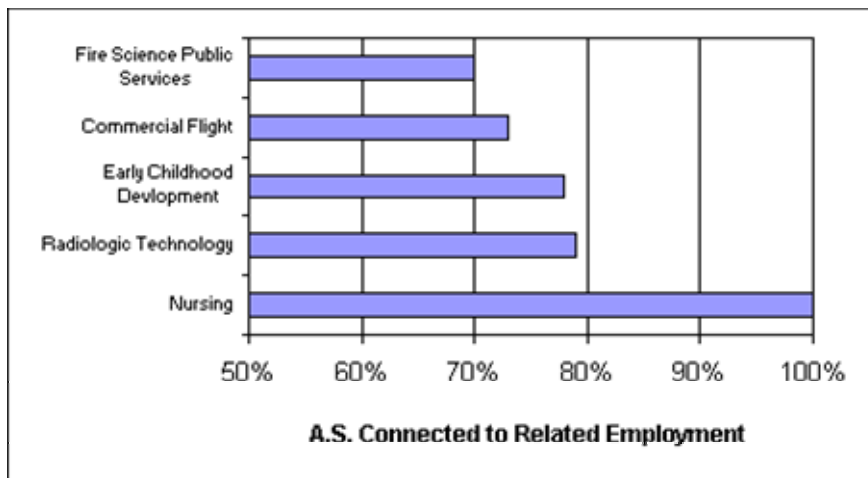
The reported employment outcomes for specific A.S. Degrees are presented in Appendix C by division and degree.

Employment/unemployment responses were received for a total of 208 Associate in Science Degrees in this report. Within this group, a total of 130 positive-employment outcomes were degree related (Table 1), representing a combined degree-related employment percentage of 62.5%. If all 180 positive-employment responses are counted, whether degree related or not, the combined employment rate for all A.S. Degree programs is 86.5%.

A.S. Degrees with particularly impressive degree-related employment responses are listed below (Chart 2). These are A.S. Degrees from Appendix C for which there were a minimum of seven employment-status responses, with at least 70% of the responses identifying degree-related employment (DRE).

- Nursing – 22 respondents, **100% DRE**
- Radiologic Technology – 14 respondents, **79% DRE**
- Early Childhood Development – 9 respondents, **78% DRE**
- Commercial Flight – 11 respondents, **73% DRE**
- Fire Science, Public Services – 10 respondents, **70% DRE**

As previously noted in the preceding section concerning employment responses for certificates, reasonable inferences cannot be made about degrees with high or low degree-related employment percentages (Appendix C) when only a few employment-status responses for a particular degree are received. However, a compilation of three years of survey data could be very useful, even if only a few respondents represent a degree program each year.

## **Conclusion**

Responses from Mt. SAC graduates who had earned A.S. Degrees and Career Certificates indicated whether or not they were employed, and whether their employment was related to the degree/certificate that they received from Mt. SAC. Important certificate-specific and degree-specific data are included in Appendices B and C respectively. These contain the most useful findings, however there is too much data in them to include in the body of this report. A brief summary of the general findings includes the following:

- Overall, 83.1% of the graduates with an A.S. Degree or certificate are employed
- The award-related employment rate for Career Certificates combined is 64.5%
- The award-related employment rate for A.S. Degrees combined is 62.5%
- The Technology and Health Division had the highest number of certificates and degrees leading to training-related employment at 196. The Business Division had 83, Natural Sciences had 39, Humanities and Social Sciences had 8, and Physical Education had 2.
- Award-related employment rates for combined A.S. Degrees and Career Certificates within the three divisions having the largest number of awards:
  - Natural Sciences – 76.5%
  - Technology and Health – 69%
  - Business – 51%

A much more accurate picture of employment outcomes for degree/certificate recipients is obtained when all graduates from every vocational program in a given year are included in the survey pool. This is more desirable than surveying a sample group; especially when a response rate as high as 63.4% can be obtained from all vocational graduates. Career Placement Services hopes to continue vocational graduate surveys such as this one, each year with similar or better response rates—providing a clearer picture of the employment success of the graduates of Mt. SAC's vocational programs.

***Note on Excluded Responses:***

This focus of this study was upon employment outcomes for A.S. Degrees and Career Certificates awarded to Mt. SAC graduates in 2001-02. In reporting the results of the survey, CPS concerned itself with data reported for those Mt. SAC graduates who either have left higher education to pursue employment, or are continuing their education at a university or college but have indicated their intent to work in the field of their degree/certificate concurrent with continuing their studies. CPS found that 57 individuals who responded to the survey did not fall within the parameters of this targeted group. The employment status responses for these individuals were not included in this report. Thirty-nine had indicated that they were progressing onward in their education and did not intend to use their degree or certificate to obtain employment while continuing their studies, therefore their responses were excluded. There were also certain certificate recipients selected by ICCIS for this study who had not completed a major certificate. These particular students had only received what might be termed “mini” certificates (e.g., Level 1 Business Certificates), which normally function as stepping-stones to higher, more comprehensive certificates. Employment status responses for these individuals were included in this study only if the respondents did not continue classes at Mt. SAC in 2002-03. Responses from 18 students who had achieved lower level business certificates in 2001-02, but were still enrolled at Mt. SAC in 2002-03, were excluded. It is presumed that many of these students will achieve a higher-level certificate and will be picked up in a future survey when they complete their programs.
