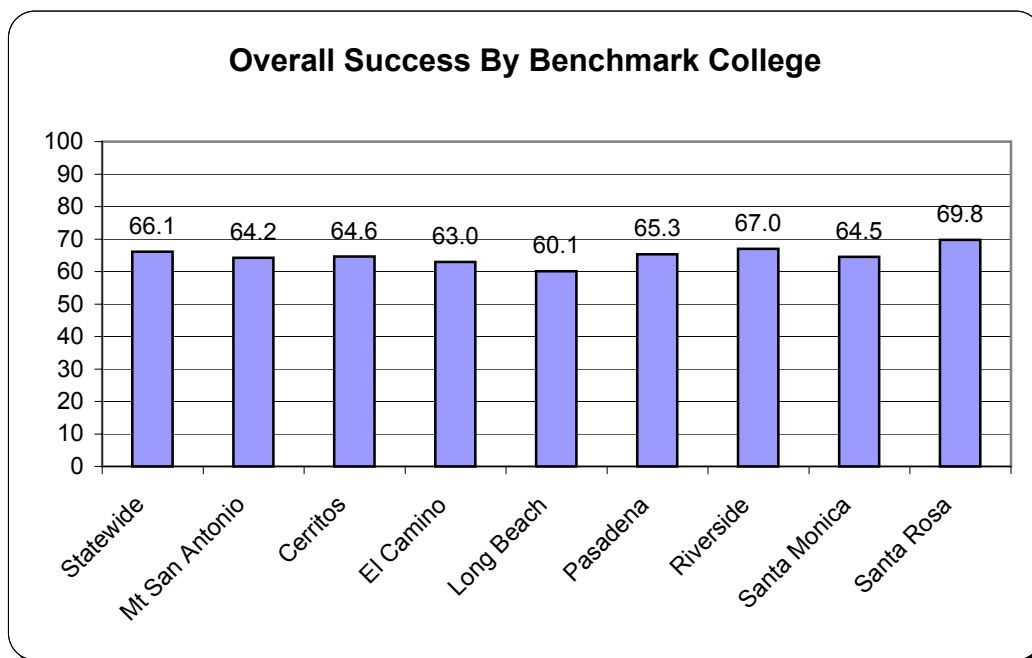


Mt. San Antonio College
Success Comparison by Ethnicity
Fall 2006

Success refers to the percentage of students who receive a grade of 'C' or better (or CR) in the course.

Overall, in Fall 2006 Mt. SAC had a higher success rate than El Camino and Long Beach.

In terms of ethnicity, African-Americans were more successful at Mt. SAC than at most of the benchmark colleges. Mt. SAC Asians were more successful than their counterparts at Long Beach.
