Student Life

Student Life provides opportunities for participation in social, club, leadership, and personal growth and development experiences.

Student Life Office Building 9C, Ext. 4525

The Student Life Office serves to counsel with and discipline students based upon the College's current Student Discipline Policy. The Office responds to Security calls regarding disciplinary problems and advises faculty and staff on issues relating to discipline. The Office assists in informing students of due process proceedings (Grievance Procedures).

A weekly bulletin is compiled and distributed by the Student Life Office to faculty and staff informing students about activities, scholarships, and services. The Office provides forms and assistance to students and staff desiring to plan a campus activity or event. This Office is where student workers can pickup their monthly paychecks. Lost and Found is located in this Office. Assistance in contacting students in life threatening emergency situations is also given in the Student Life Office.

Information regarding clubs and opportunities for on campus involvement can be found in the Student Life Office. Finally, the Student Life Office is where the Executive Offices of the Associated Students are located and where you can find club mail boxes.

Student Center Building 9C, Ext. 4528

The Student Center, located in Building 9C serves as the focal point for student activities and programs. The Center creates a supportive and relaxing environment where students can interact with one another along with staff and faculty. The Student Center serves as a meeting place for social functions, activities, lectures, clubs, and student government. In the Student Center, you can find the Gay and Lesbian Support Center and the Alpha Gamma Sigma Honor Society office. The Center offers activities, games, and a relaxing place to do homework or watch television. The Center is the place to find information about off-campus housing.

Student Government is recognized as the official student voice on all College issues. There are 20 Senate positions available to students interested in becoming involved in the shared governance of the College. The Senate allocates monies to support various College programs, events, and services. A.S. meetings are held every Tuesday and Thursday in the Student Center, Building 9C Room 5 from 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. There are opportunities for joining Student Court, the organization which reviews violations of student policies and directives.
