

- The Mt. SAC Continuing Education Division (SCE) is the 4<sup>th</sup> largest noncredit program in California Community Colleges
- SCE was established in 1971
- In 2014-15 SCE generated 5,949 Full-Time Equivalent Student (FTES)
- SCE holds a dual accreditation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (ACCJC and ACS)
- SCE programs serve students across the lifespan including adult learners, minors, and senior citizens
- Noncredit courses are offered four terms per year (winter, spring, summer, fall) with weekend and evening options available
- SCE student support facilities include the Language Learning Center, WIN student athlete support center, ABE Career Center, ESL Library, Language SMART lab, as well as multiple on-campus and off-campus computer labs (ABE, ESL, EOA)
- Classes are available on the Mt. SAC campus and at over 50 communitybased sites such as schools, senior and community centers
- SCE counselors and educational advisors held 4,174 individual student appointments in 2014-15
- Fee-based classes and programs include Career and Professional Development, Personal Enrichment, Sports and Fitness, Children and Teens, and Online Learning
- The Mt. SAC Workforce Training Center was re-launched in July 2014 to provide customized performancebased training in the community
- Community Education (fee-based) and Contract Training served 6,529 students in 2014-15
