| 4. | State Budget Update | The following are highlights of the discussion: Governor announced his commitment to fund 8.22% cost of living adjustment but there is a tradeoff for K-12 education taking back billions of dollars from multiyear one-time funding previously approved The May Revision for the 2023-24 fiscal year entails a series of cuts to various one-time investments while allocating additional funds to accommodate a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for apportionments Tentative budget will be reviewed by Cabinet in June | Accreditation Standard - IIID. | |

| 5. | Retiree Health Benefits and OPEB | The following are highlights of the discussion: The retiree health premiums are payments for medical insurance paid on behalf of retirees. These payments are included in each employee negotiated bargaining unit agreement. OPEB is the trust that has the funds set aside to pay for the retiree's health premiums and it is an irrevocable trust. The budget has an ongoing allocation of \$2.5 million to fund the retiree's health premiums. The payment is made every June. The estimated retiree health premiums expenditure for 2022-23 is \$5.2 million. The total OPEB liability for 2021-22 was \$154.9 million. Of this, \$90.5 million is in the OPEB Trust, the funded ratio is 58%. Accreditation expects a reasonable plan to fund the OPEB liability. | |
