Jamaika expressed that by having the GE options, students are exposed to other disciplines that may help them develop interest in other areas that would enrich them. Should GE courses be excluded from any recommendation of limits? GE courses can enrich a student's experience, but GE bloat is a concern. How can this be balanced? What happens if new GE courses are continuously developed?
