<p>OEI Update (Meghan)</p>	<p>Spring 2018 was the launch of the Online Course Exchange.</p> <p>Summary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 14 students attempted to enroll through the Course Exchange software. • Of those, 10 got through the process. • Of the 10 students, 9 are taking classes at LTCC, 1 at Mt. SAC (GEOG 1). • Of the 14 total, 2 dropped after enrolling and paying for their classes. • Participation in the Course Exchange moved students forward in achieving their educational goals. Some examples: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 4 needed the class(es) offered at LTCC in order to graduate or transfer at the end of this semester. These are courses that Mt. SAC does not offer fully online: POLS 100 and MATH 110. - 2 students maxed out on their repeats for ENGL 1A at Mt. SAC. Being able to repeat it at LTCC means they don't have to travel to another college (IIA)
