Academic Senate Update	Senate voted for a task force to be created to define REC as per faculty contract (if it is ratified)
CVC-OEI Meeting Report (continued)	To review, the OEI is now known as the CVC-OEI Consortium. The group has been expanded to include the California Virtual Campus, the Online Education Initiative, and @ONE, the training unit of the OEI. The CVC Exchange currently hosts an inventory of 100% online courses called Finish Faster Now. Mt. SAC is still working to ensure that our 100% online offerings are represented in this directory – Quottly has been sent correct data sets but does not seem to have fixed the issue yet. New vendor n2n will handle cross enrollment. Mt SAC will be part of the cohort in Spring 2020. The CVC-OEI is promoting online degrees. ADJU is very close to being Mt. SAC's first online transfer degree. It was noted that some disciplines are barred from completely online degrees/ certificates by their accrediting bodies (e.g., Paralegal). 2 new tools are coming for free to the consortium: Name Coach and Note Bowl.

SPOT Review	 Chancellor's office is open to colleges collaborating on certificates to offer low enrolled classes (i.e., one class, ≥2 colleges filling the class). This is still in the planning stage. IIA, IIIC Since August 31, 2018: There have been 23 faculty requests to join SPOT Five faculty members have submitted their courses for review. Three of those courses have been returned for further work. Two faculty have become SPOT certified, both after submitting good courses which had to be returned for relatively minor changes. Division by division statistics for the 23 requests to join SPOT since August 31: Natural Sciences: 6 requests Technology and Health: 5 requests Business: 4 requests Arts: 3 requests There are currently 204 SPOT participants 10 faculty still have not accepted their invitations
