	Announcements	The catalog links to the GPS maps were broken and had to be fixed. This is an ongoing issue and those links have to be repaired multiple times a year. We are working with the vendor to embed the maps in the catalog pages as a separate tab on the catalog program pages. There was a script issue within the GPS maps. The "or" and "and" options and units were missing. A fix was implemented, and this issue has been resolved. There is another script error where units were missing on about 20 program maps. This is being investigated. It may be a data transfer issue from DegreeWorks.
