Kinesiology wasn't defined, no distinction between trainers and wasn't sure about what degree to obtain. GPS map had a broken link within the catalog. Job titles didn't specify which degree/certificate linked</li> <li><u>School Psychologist</u> – Search steps seemed to have too much text (too much text = being</li> </ul>		

	<ul> <li>overwhelmed). Recommends a "Get Help" button for students use if they have questions. Group suggested hosting an enrollment dates event; similar to "Cash for college". Event would gear towards new students to help them with applying, receiving info about clubs, programs and student services.</li> <li>Teachers – Found it difficult to navigate on website and finding information. Didn't find information for steps towards being a Teacher or information on Teacher's Prep Institute (TPI); only found info on daycare workers.</li> <li>Game Designer – Reviewed enrollment process and found too many clicks to get to your destination; it's confusing to locate information. No connection between step 1 and step 2. There is a disconnect.</li> <li>Civil Engineering – Able to find price and civil engineering webpage easily, but no updated info on website; page needs to be updated. Using catalog is confusing and isn't user friendly.</li> <li>Homework</li> <li>Committee is asked to look at their roles and what part do they play in GPS. Ask themselves: "what can I do to contribute to the work we do in this committee?" Bring ideas for next meeting. Use the presented ideas at next meeting to craft goals for next year and make these recommendations to the college. Review the child development and International websites.
