Based on an issue reported by a counselor, counselors need to be aware that students should not be sent to take Math Placement Tests. DRP:	Recommendation to add "None of the above" to the "Please select one of the following" question in the "Did not attend a US high school" branch of the AQ.

	Patricia recommends that students should be allowed to	
	take the DRP without additional screening.	
	Not currently giving DRP at high schools.	
	Math Placement Specialists:	
	Patricia asked about Math Placement Specialists. David shared	
	that students should be directed to the Math Department for now	
	until we get final approval about the Math Placement Specialist	
	role.	
	HS Outreach:	
	Melissa from HS Outreach reported on experiences since May 7 th	
	release of AQ 2.	
	1. Students were submitting without results. This has been	
	fixed already. These students will have to redo AQ.	
	2. Students weren't allowed to change major because	
	couldn't select term. Chuong and Audrey said it's the same	
	issue as above. This will be worked on. It's for students	
	who have future term admission.	
	Tannia shared that HS Outreach sent out 4500 letters telling	
	students that they can register for transfer-level if take AQ.	
	Mountie Fast Track:	
	Audrey and Katrina shared that Mountie Fast Track last night had	
	35 students. Very positive feedback. Walked students through	
	the AQ. Only a few issues. Some forgot usernames/passwords,	
	some couldn't change majors, one student couldn't finish AQ.	
	Showed videos on main screen with audio, which worked well.

	Francisco: 9 th grade student is a question still. 10 th and 11 th grade	
	students should see a counselor. 12 th grade students will have	
	completed 3 years, so those students can take AQ.	
	Michelle clarified that most students in dual enrollment are 12 th graders. Sometimes the AQ is used to provide prerequisite clearance for other classes.	
	Francisco only meets with Special Admits that are 14 years old and	
	younger (gifted students). Counselors do orientation, and go	
	through student records. Counselors sign off on students enrolling in our courses.	
	In response to a question, Bev stated that we can differentiate	
	Special Admit students in Banner. Joel shared that there are also	
	ways to identify Dual Enrollment students.	
	Audrey commented that we need to be able to differentiate	
	between students who are currently in high school vs. dropped	
	out of high school.	
	Patricia asked: When students with less than 3 years of high	
	school are referred to counselor, how do counselors enter	
	eligibilities in?	
	Bev, IT, and Patricia will work on this question.	

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		The committee agreed that the message to students with less than 3 years of high school should be "see a counselor".	
		Anyone who has US HS information but not 3 years (and no diploma) gets this information: "Since you don't have 3 years of English at a US high school, please see a counselor."	
		 The following to-do list for IT was reviewed: Change message to "See Counselor" for students who have less than 3 years of high school. On closing page, put "Next Steps" in a box that stands out. Mechanism for counselors to enter in eligibility. (Francisco will request through George or Audrey for authorization.) If student says they have associates on the AQ, their placement will be ENGL 1A and READ 100. The committee agreed that until we can fix it AQ message, we will 	
		give AWE to any students who ask for it.
