	school are getting two different results on the AQ. For reading, they're	
	directed to see a counselor (where student uses guided self-placement	
	to select course). These students are directed to take the AWE for	
	English placement. The current reason for this is that the DRP is not	
	allowed, but the AWE is. But it would be worth it to examine this	
	process from a student's point-of-view. We don't want this to be a	
	barrier for students, but we don't want to underplace students either.	
	An idea was suggested to research how many students who got a "See	
	Counselor" message for Read actually visited a counselor.
