4. <u>1-Year Throughput Report</u> (Maria)	4. M. Tsai presented her preliminary report - AB 705 Research: Trend of Access and One-Year Throughput Rates in Transfer-Level English and Math.	
	<ul> <li>The following data points are included:         <ul> <li>Access to transfer-level English/math</li> </ul> </li> <li>Throughput within one year from taking first ENGL and MATH course</li> <li>Access and throughput data by gender and ethnicity</li> <li>Fall 2019 cohort only: throughput rate by HS GPA and Student profiles of 1YR throughput Completers and Noncompleters</li> </ul>	
	Key points: "Access rate" and "throughput rate" (based on AB 705 guidelines) <b>Throughput</b> is defined as successfully completing transfer-level math or English <b>within one year</b> .	
	Increased trends in access to transfer-level English from Fall 2015 to Fall 2019 were noted and gaps in access by ethnicity decreased.	
	Overall throughput rate in Fall 2019 was 68.7%. Differences were noted in throughput rates by gender; however, gaps were not high enough to reflect disproportionate impact. Gaps in ethnicity were	

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	noted with Black or African American and Hispanic or Latino are	
	disproportionately impacted in Fall 2019.	
	Overall, access to transfer-level math increased from 26.3% in Fall	
	2015 to 72% in Fall 2019. By gender, gaps were noted however	
	these are not considered significant. Gaps in ethnicity have narrowed.	
	Overall, the throughput rate for transfer-level math increased from	
	22.5% in Fall 2015 to 39.3% in Fall 2019. Throughput disaggregated	
	by ethnicity shows continued disproportionate impact for Black or	
	African American and Hispanic or Latino students.	
	Fall 2019 English Cohort one-year throughput by HS GPA shows that	
	students with HS GPAs of <1.9 have throughput rates of 32%.	
	Fall 2019 Math Cohort one-year throughput by HS GPA shows that	
	students with HS GPAs of <2.3 have throughput rates of 10.5%.	
	For Fall 2015 and Fall 2019 Math Cohorts, across all three measures,	
	African American or Black and Latino or Hispanic students were	
	disproportionally impacted.

	& Matriculation Committee members drafting research requests	
	related to all departments, not just one area. D. Beydler shared the	
	RIE research request process. M. Tsai suggested adding as much	
	detail as possible so a researcher who specializes in a specific area
