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4. Updates from Audrey (Audrey)	A memo was shared from the California Acceleration Project (CAP)	
	with highlights from research on AB 705 implementation. Mt. SAC	
	data was included in the memo and was discussed by the	
	committee.	
	The memo reported that in Fall 2020, more below-transfer-level	
	math courses were offered than transfer-level math courses with	
	corequisites.	
	CAP is available to provide a consultant to discuss interventions and	
	recommendations for English and math such as corequisite support,	
	just-in-time remediation, addressing affective domain issues,	
	unconscious bias, classroom collaboration, etc.	
	Math Department leaders and AB 705 Math Committee is meeting	
	to discuss adding affective domain topics in corequisites and	
	professional development for instructors who teach the corequisite	
	courses. The Math Department also has a new Equity Committee	
	that will share best practices with the Math Department (informed	
	by CORA training, etc.). The Math Department Community of	
	Practice will also involve discussion with other Natural Science	
	faculty to better align math and science courses. Corequisite best	
	practices such as collaborative student work and classes that are	
	not lecture driven are also under discussion. Math is also	
	considering having a point person (funded by SEAP or GPS mini-	
	grant funding) to coordinate and maintain math resources in	
	OneDrive or a toolkit. The goal is to facilitate sharing resources	
	between math faculty members.	
	There was a recommendation to use SEAP mini-grant funding to	
	promote departmental work on faculty professional development.	
	A recommendation was also made to participate in the Community	
	College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE).	

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	The Humanities Division has submitted a new request for SEAP mini-grant funding to support a division-wide community of practice.
