Vision, Mission Statement, and Core Values drives what is in our Educational and Facilities Master Plan (EFMP) and sets the foundation of our Strategic Plan, which in turn drives our annual PIE process. Communication is one of the largest pieces of integrated planning with KPI's being the common thread in it all.

Comments included: perhaps do this every other year; there are resource requests that do not belong in PIE; better use of Outcomes; simplify the diagram; follow-up on funded improvements; change labels of arrows; PIE allocation missing.
