3.02 Climate Commitment and Environmental Justice Committee (CCEJC) (Anders/Babtiwale)

- Four Faculty Cohorts have completed Professional Development training.
- Nine student internships in Spring 2023.
- Climate Action Plan kickoff set for Fall 2022

3.03 Information Technology Advisory Committee (ITAC) - (Moore)

Anthony Moore reported ITAC had a discussion on Web CMS, a group will come together
to address the issues Faculty has currently, also working with AVP of Instruction, Meghan
Chen.

- Technology Master Plan is complete and posted online
- ITAC had a demo of software called LabStat which tracks inventory, meters/tracks how licenses are used, overuse/underuse tracking, we can remove licenses that we no longer use/need.
- New Student Technology support website is live, one-stop-shop, Faculty in ITAC had great recommendations.
- Wayfinding is live on mtsac.edu. Gives directions from your location to the spaces around campus.
- Technology assistance will be available in the tech hub at the new Student Center.
- Process to prioritize incoming technology projects is currently being finalized and will go to ITAC, PC, for final approval.

3.04 Institutional Effectiveness Committee (IEC)

- Patty reported on the two attachments in BoardDocs, Integrated Planning and Budgeting Process Calendar and the Integrated Planning Model, were updated through a joint effort with the Budget Committee, PIE, and IEC. The gears in the Integrated Planning Model attachment show that these plans are in motion. Accreditation Steering also reviewed the attachments and gave feedback.
- Expanded PAC agenda is being worked on and will be sent to Dr. Scroggins for review.
