1. Review of October 26, 2022, Meeting Notes

Minutes of October 26, 2022, were approved, as amended.

2. Accreditation Steering Committee (ASC) - Update

Allie Frickert reported that this committee has met since their last meeting.

- The website provides the accreditation timeline of events.
- Fall theme is inclusivity with recruitment presentations that have occurred across campus.
- ISER is currently going through its screening process with processes in place for feedback and improvement.
- Three forums are scheduled for the fall.
- There is a collaboration with the Outcomes team.

3. Climate Commitment and Environmental Justice Committee (CCEJC) – Update

Tania Anders and Eera Babtiwale reported that this committee has met since their last meeting.

- Nearly 25 trained faculty from across campus will be "Leaf" designated.
- A sustainability video will be available to all "Leaf" certified faculty.
- Greenbag Luncheons are back by popular demand.
- Sustainability internships are being developed through a variety of partnerships.
- The Climate Action Plan Kickoff is scheduled for 2023.
- Dr. Scroggins recommended a campus survey asking how sustainability has changed your lifestyle.

4. Information Technology Advisory Committee (ITAC) – Update

Anthony Moore reported this committee has met since our last meeting:

- Focus has remained on the IT Master Plan update.
- In a survey, the most critical aspects of student success are Wi-Fi, laptop and hotspot loaner program, apps on cell phones, and canvas.
- Students are asking for more training and in-person support.
- Accreditation Finishing Team continues to work hard.

5. Strong Workforce Advisory Committee (SWAC) - Update

Jennifer Galbraith reported that this committee has met since our last meeting:

- Applications have been processed for three different levels of local funding totaling \$2.4 million.
- There was a total of 55 applications.
- Recommendations for selection will be presented to Dr. Scroggins for final decision.
- The huge interest will make this program innovative.

6. Overall Campus Equity Update

Koji Uesugi shared that in celebration of Native American Heritage month, the First Peoples Native Center held its grand opening. There was lots of support and it is nice to have a permanent home.

An Ha shared the Associated Student senators will be speaking at the Board meeting on sexual harassment training and recommending mandatory training on campus. Also, student parents are working on a resolution for the creation of their own space on campus.
