2. ACCJC Annual and Fiscal Reports

Daniel Beruman provided an overview of the Annual Report:

- The purpose of the two reports is to monitor Institutional Growth and institution Set Standards for Key Indicators annually. This ensures the college is holding themselves accountable for continuous improvement based on our mission and goals.
- The annual reports contains many content areas such as Headcount Enrollment Data, Distance Education, Federal Data/Graduation Rate, and Institutional Set Standards (ISS) for Student Achievement.
- Stretch and aspiration goals are the topics that need to be addressed.

Rosa Royce provided an overview of the Fiscal Report:

- Based on our 311 report, the most important financial report for community colleges, our audit report has been approved with no audit findings.
- We have an actual fund balance of \$61 million, a high amount of reserve funds that is based on challenges in the fiscal year.
- The majority of carryover funds is from International Student Fees.
- We do not have any Unrestricted General Fund debt.
- We have a \$72.4 million balance in OPEB.
