In the fall The Great Shake Out is scheduled. Melonee would also like to present the Alertis desktop alert.  This summer she wants implement Nims, and Sims training. Sims/Nims combination training class is available. If employed full time at Mt SAC, you are required to take introduction class through Sims 100 and Nims 700. If completed online it takes about 10 hours or more. The Sims/Nims combination takes approximately 8 hours only.  Duetta – Sims/Nims program is this provided through FEMA?	Melonee – will reach out to Bill Eastman on the Alertis desktop on what the process would be in shutting off the alert system if activated.

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Melonee, FEMA does provide the training, but it is not handled online. Instructors are available for Mt SAC and could have the process completed in 1 day.

Duetta - Would this be recommended for staff who has already taken the Sims/Nims training?

Melonee – Once you have already taken the training, no need to retake this course again. You are able to go onto the FEMA website for student ID, and pull student picture. Pod also has record on file.

Steve – Train the trainer also is provided, and can be completed within 4-5 hours.

Melonee – Certs (Community Emergency Response Team) is coming up. Public Safety instructors are available to be used in small sections. There are more in house trainers to take part of the Cert program. Cert bags will be used as training tools.

Duetta – What is the recommendation for emergency kits? It would be more than a first aid kit in each building. Just in case someone was isolated to the building.

Melonee – Before we can provide the kit training that is needed. It is possible to have it in the building, If there has been no training, the building Marshall or Floor Captains need to respond. Cert training would be helpful.

	Marti – Nurses have Trauma kits, and all police officers have them and the department has been trained in active shooter trauma kit. The department does train the staff, public safety and other departments.  Melonee – is planning a table top exercise for a full campus exercise with the community agency, sheriff departments, highway patrol, City of Diamond Bar, and City of Covina. These are all involved or impacted when we leave the campus. Also want to invite to table top public safety, student services, and other areas, to show what plan is being implemented

This is something that Mt SAC does not need to have on campus Duetta - How many registered nurses are on campus to administer this to? What if this is available Marti – All registered, and full time nurses on campus, and 3 part time, and the phsician who are available can administer this to someone Marti – Providers of CPR training is encouraging to have Narcan on campus Duetta – Mt SAC needs to be educated on Narcan before we can make a final decision Duetta – If Narcan is something we want on campus, this should be addressed to Mike for approval. Marti what is your protocol for approval in Health Services? Marti – If it's already in place no approval is needed. Marti – Marti will put together all information documents on Narcan.
