A new icon to support student equity has now been added to the class registration schedule. In addition to the state-required icon to designate courses with zero-cost instructional materials, a second icon to designate "low-cost" materials, defined as \$40 or less based on our campus bookstore prices, is now available to be added to your courses! TIMC worked with the Office of Instruction to develop a single Smartsheet to be utilized each term by faculty who would like to designate their courses as either Zero or Low Cost. This is a separate process from the bookstore requisition form; the icon helps students to find classes that are more affordable to them.
