The Mt. San Antonio College Catalog contains the most recent information regarding Grading Symbols. This document is updated annually for currency and correctness using a review process that includes consultation with the Academic Senate.

When grades are given for any course of instruction, the g <u>The instructor of the course</u> <u>determines the g</u>rade<u>s</u> given earned to by each student shall be the grade determined by the instructor of the course. The determination of the student's grade, in the absence of mistake, fraud, bad faith, or incompetency, shall be final.

(a) <u>The District may offer courses on a Pass/NoPass basis, Standard grade mode or</u> <u>both. The college's catalog will denote which options are available for a given</u> <u>course. The desired grade mode choice for credit courses can be made at</u> <u>registration but must be finalized no later than the 30% of the course. Standard</u> <u>letter grades (A, B, C, D, F) may be assigned for both credit and noncredit</u> <u>courses.</u>

- (b) <u>Upon completion of at least 30% of the credit course, the student may no longer</u> <u>make changes to the grade mode on file.</u>
- (c) <u>All units earned on a "pass-no pass" basis shall be counted in satisfaction of community college curriculum requirements.</u>
- (d) <u>Units earned on a "pass-no pass" basis shall not be used to calculate grade</u> <u>point averages. However, credit units attempted for which "NP" is recorded shall</u> <u>be considered in probation and dismissal procedures.</u>
- (e) <u>Noncredit grades have do not have any effect on students' credit transcript</u> academic record.

SAC we</u> <u>developed the "V" to recognize that opportunities to participate in the learning process</u> <u>were limited during the Covid-19 pandemic and therefore grades from this time could</u> <u>reflect not only students' academic achievement but also the impact of the pandemic</u> <u>on student performance.</u>

<u> </u>	Incomplete – Incomplete academic work for
	unforeseeable, emergency, and justifiable
	reasons at the end of the term may result in an
	<u>"I" symbol being entered in a student's record.</u>
	The condition for removal of the "I" shall be
	stated by the instructor in a written record.
	This record shall contain the conditions for the
	removal of the "I" and the grade assigned in
	lieu of its removal. A final grade shall be
	assigned when the work stipulated has been
	completed and evaluated, or when the time
	limit for completing the work has passed. The
	"I" may be made up no later than one year
	following the end of the term in which it was
	assigned. The "I" symbol shall not be used in
	calculating units attempted nor for grade
	points.
<u>w</u>	Withdrawal - Assigned to students who
	officially withdraw from a class. "W" grades
	are not used in calculating GPA, but are used

	as factors in probation and dismissal
	procedures.
MW	Military Withdrawal – Students who receive military orders compelling withdrawal from classes shall be permitted to withdraw at any time with no adverse impact on academic records or enrollment status. Students shall show copies of military orders before the "MW" can be processed. Military withdrawal shall not be counted in progress probation or dismissal calculations.
<u>EW</u>	<u>"Excused Withdrawal" (EW) occurs when a</u> <u>student is permitted to withdraw from a</u> <u>course(s) due to specific events beyond the</u> <u>control of the student affecting his or her</u> <u>ability to complete a course(s) and may</u> <u>include a job transfer outside the geographical</u> <u>region, an illness in the family where the</u> <u>student is the primary caregiver, when the</u> <u>student who is incarcerated in a California</u> <u>state prison or county jail is released from</u> <u>custody or involuntarily transferred before the</u> <u>end of the term, when the student is the</u> <u>subject of an immigration action, or other</u> <u>extenuating circumstances as described in</u> <u>(a)(2), making course completion</u> <u>impracticable. In the case of an incarcerated</u> <u>student, an excused withdrawal cannot be</u> <u>applied if the failure to complete the course(s)</u> <u>was the result of a student's behavioral</u> <u>violation or if the student requested and was</u> <u>granted a mid-semester transfer. Upon</u> <u>verification of these conditions and consistent</u> <u>with the district's required documentation</u> <u>substantiating the condition, an excused</u> <u>withdrawal symbol may be assigned at any</u> <u>time after the period established by the</u> <u>governing board during which no notation is</u> <u>made for withdrawals. The withdrawal symbol</u> <u>so assigned shall be an "EW."</u>
<u>IP</u>	The "IP" symbol shall be used only in those courses which extend beyond the normal end of an academic term. It indicates that work is "in progress" but that assignment of an evaluative symbol (grade) must await its completion. The "IP" symbol shall remain on the student's permanent record in order to satisfy enrollment documentation. The appropriate evaluative symbol (grade) and unit credit shall be assigned and appear on the student's permanent record for the term in which the course is completed. The "IP" shall not be used in calculating grade point averages.
<u>RD</u>	The "RD" symbol may only be assigned by the Office of Admissions and Records. It is to be used when there is a delay in reporting the grade of a student due to circumstances beyond the control of the student. It is a temporary notation to be replaced by a permanent symbol as soon as possible. "RD" shall not be used in calculating grade point

averages.

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
