## AP 4250 Probation

Title 5 Sections 55030, 55031, 55032, 55033, 55034

Notification of Probation: Each student will be notified of <u>their his/her</u> academic <u>probation or</u> <u>progress probation difficulty</u> and the availability of College support services to respond to the academic difficulty before the student is dismissed.

Notification will consist, at a minimum, of the following:

- At the end of the semester in which the student's <u>cumulative Mt. SAC</u> grade point average falls below 2.0 in <u>all units attempted</u>, a notice shall be sent to the student informing <u>themhim/her</u> that <u>theyhe/she</u> is <u>are</u> on academic probation.
- At the end of the semester in which the student's percentage of all enrolled units for which entries of "W," "I," <u>"NC,"</u> "NP," and/or "NPV" are recorded reaches or exceeds fifty percent (50%), a notice shall be sent to the student informing <u>themhim/her</u> that <u>theyhe/she is are</u> on progress probation.

<u>Restriction on Enrollment</u>: Upon recording of probation students shall have their registration restricted, be required to participate in a prescribed counseling intervention, and be limited to enroll in a maximum of 12 units in subsequent semesters and 4 units in subsequent winter and summer intersessions while on probation.

For the purposes of this section, semesters shall be considered consecutive on the basis of the student's enrollment, so long as the break in the student's enrollment does not equal two exceed one primary terms or more. (Intersessions do not count towards this limit).
