4. Counseling Update (Francisco; Jesse)	Jesse mentioned there were issues with several students with AMLA/1A placement registering for English 1A. When AMLA/1A gets populated as a result of the AQ, the students are not getting cleared for English 1A pre- requisites. They are getting the pre-requisite test score error so they have to get manually cleared. Jesse will provide examples to both George and Nico so they can determine what the problem is. Francisco indicated they are looking to upgrade to the latest version of DegreeWorks as Ellucian will no longer be supporting the classic DegreeWorks. School of Continuing Education Update (Liza / Naomi)	<ul> <li>Liza indicated they are very excited to announce they are very close to the soft launch of the online interactive noncredit orientation. This orientation will branch out to five different member groups: ABE, ESL, Short Term Voc, Voc Re-entry, and the IMPACT Students (adults with disabilities). The orientation will also be in three different languages: Chinese, Spanish, and English. She will report on how it is going by the time the committee reconvenes in the Fall.</li> <li>Naomi: Along the lines of AB 1705, ABE already has AIME classes but they are actually working on pre-AIME classes to help students in the IMPACT Program that require a bit more support. The pre-AIME classes will help them build to AIME, then build additional skills to help transition to ACCESS 30, working their way to English 1A.</li> </ul>
