# Retention and Persistence<sup>1</sup> Committee

(Academic Senate Committee – Reports to Student Preparation, Equity, & Achievement Council)

## Purpose:

The purpose of the Retention and Persistence Committee is to make recommendations on the planning and coordination of programs, services, and interventions which support student equity, retention, persistence, <u>academic</u> success, <u>and well-being throughout their Mt. SAC Education</u>. The committee is concerned with the entire student experience throughout their Mt. SAC education. This Committee <u>reviews</u> considers data necessary to make informed decisions recommendations and reports on the assessment of campus services for students that support student retention, persistence, and success.

## **Function:**

- To make recommendations for the coordination and maintenance of timely and accessible programs, pedagogical interventions, and services to support equity, retention, and persistence. These may <u>include</u> student success management system, early alert, academic support, <u>basic needs</u>, and methods to support faculty identification and referral of students who will benefit from support.
- Review current practices, policies, and procedures and recommend (with <u>input from</u> stakeholder<u>s</u> input) needed policies and procedures to support early interventions, strategies, and services.
- 3. Remain informed on the impact of programs and pedagogical strategies that support retention and persistence, with an emphasis on analysis and reporting of equity gaps. Encourage a positive culture at the College that normalizes support and help-seeking behaviors.
- **4.** Assist the college community in broadening and deepening understanding and knowledge of early intervention programs services, pedagogical practices, and interventions, including early intervention programs, to increase the use and efficacy of these resources.
- 5. Gather input from faculty involved in **corequisite** and other support interventions on student needs, and work to support the connections between instruction and support services.

- 7. Collaborate with Research and Institutional Effectiveness (RIE) to gather, review, and analyze data pertaining to student retention, persistence, and success to determine the effectiveness of student support interventions and the need for new interventions.
