ELECTRONIC RESOURCES

Typical Citation (see MLA Handbook, section 5.9)

Document from an Internet Site (section 5.9.1)

Author. "Title of Document." Title of Site, Project or Database. Name of editor (if given). Electronic publication information, including version number (if given). Date of electronic publication or of latest update. Name of any sponsoring institution or organization. Date of access <URL>.

An Entire Internet Site (section 5.9.2)

Title. Editor (if given). Electronic publication information. Date of access <URL>.

Article in an Online Database (see sections 5.9.2-4 and 5.9.7)

Note: This citation is like a normal periodical citation except that you add the name of the database (underlined), the database producer, the name of the library, and the date you accessed the article. If you know the URL of the service's homepage, give it, in angle brackets (eg. <www.epnet.com>), immediately after the date of access, or you may simply end with the date of access (recommended).
