

Columbia College (Sonora)

Background

Yosemite Community College District

Housing consists of 48 apartments in four, three-story buildings, for a total of 105 students. Managed by California Student Housing, LLC.

Has had housing since 1986

Sonora population: 4,808 (2013)

Security

An in-house security officer and a camera surveillance system provide security.

Student discipline

Most cases involve alcohol and drugs

Occupancy rates

Decreases seen as a result of downturn in enrollment. Current occupancy at around 60 to 75 percent.

Cerro Coso Community College (Mammoth Lakes)

Background

Kern Community College District

Student apartments adjacent to the Eastern Sierra College Center's Mammoth Lakes campus are available for single or double occupancy. The Mammoth Lakes Foundation manages the buildings.

Mammoth Lakes population: 8,073 (2013)

Security

Access card security system and security monitors throughout the building.

Student discipline

Behavioral issues comprise most of the discipline cases. Housing director noted problems with drinking, smoking cigarettes and marijuana, and noise violations

Occupancy rates

Enrollment decreases have negatively impacted occupancy rates.

Food

No meal plan required or offered; however, students are provided one free meal per week.

The second type houses four residents with two students in each room.

Has had housing for more than four decades.

The two-story buildings each have four wings with a common bathroom facility on each wing. Rooms are double occupancy. The buildings are co-ed, with men and women on separate wings.
