 - a. 2022-2023 CO [Compendium](#) Report
 - b. SEAP overall budget for 22-23 is about \$497,781,950
 - i. An additional \$25 million allocated for all of the colleges for 22-23
 1. Funding will go out in February 2023 (*see note from Anthony Amboy below in italics*)
 - ii. CO does not want these increases to go straight into salaries. They would like to see that colleges prioritize service provision for students
 - iii. Anthony and Mike will be sending out an email about the SEAP budget update via the list-serv.

From Anthony Amboy via email on 9/30/22 following our SEAP Region 8 meeting.

*“I have a SEA Funds Correction: Apportionment total for P1 (February) is **\$497,781,950**. I knew I was off by some digits, but I wanted to be sure to say the entire correct number.*

*Colleges will see the increase for the 2022-23 year reflected in the remaining apportionment balance, so the 60% of overall fund from advance will be applied to the remaining 40% from February to June; all of that is to say that the increase will be reflected in the budget and will affect the monthly amounts colleges receive as a noticeably stark increase for **the back half of the 2022-23 fiscal year only**. Apportionment for 2023-24 (Pending additional increases) will see the apportionment **balanced and set** to the apportionment schedule. The amount \$497,781,950 is the new, ongoing apportionment.”*

- c. Guided Pathways Funds
 - i. \$47.5 M
 - ii. CO will be working w/ district reps to ensure that multi-college districts see the funds at the college level
 - iii. 4 years to expend the funds
- d. The CO would like for us to spend the money within the spending cycle—unspent money makes it impossible for the CO to advocate to the legislative body for more money
- e. 2020-2021 Term End Expenditure Report
 - i. Many colleges have already turned in the report
 - ii. Reach out to SEAP if you need an extension






ii. Structure of meetings
