#### 21-22 Survey Responses

#### **Graduate Survey Questions mapped to Institutional Level Outcomes (ILO's)**

As part of its assessment plan, Mt. SAC conducted an Institutional Level Outcomes (ILO) assessment in Spring 2022. A graduate survey was designed to be administered to spring graduates to assess student perception of learning and growth. One portion of the survey contained 15 items intended to measure four ILOs (Communication, Critical Thinking, Information and Technology Literacy, and Personal, Social, Civic, and Environmental Responsibility. A total of 467 students responded to these survey questions. The results of the survey are summarized in the following sections.

Comprehending, analyzing, and responding appropriately to oral, written, and visual information.
