

What is accreditation?

 The quality or state of being trustworthy or credible to student learning (Root is French word meaning "to credit")

An ongoing cycle of school improvement





What is WASC?

The Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) is one of six regional accrediting associations in the United States.

WASC has three commissions:

- Accrediting Commission for Schools ACS
 - o Post-secondary Adult Education ROCP
- Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC)
- Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities



Why Accreditation?

Affirms our current efforts to support the Institutional Level Outcomes (ILOs) process by:

- •Increasing what students know
- •Increasing what students can do
- •Improving how students feel
 - o about themselves
 - o about others
 - o about learning

And ...



- Certifies to the public that the School of Continuing Education is a trustworthy Adult Education institution of learning
 - UC approval of A-G requirements
 - Cal Grants
 - Acceptance into the military
 - Transfer of credits
- Institutionalizes a cycle of improvement of SCE programs and operations to support student learning

WASC Accreditation Process

- School self-evaluation based on school's mission, ILOs, and WASC criteria resulting in the writing of a Self-Study Report
- Peer review accomplished by a 3½ day visit by a committee
- Implementation of the schoolwide Action Plan that addresses key issues identified by the school and Visiting Committee

YEAR ONE

Profile Update, Refinement of Schoolwide Action Plan

YEAR SIX

Completion of Self-Study, including refinement of Schoolwide Action Plan; Self-Study Visit; Revision of Schoolwide Action Plan after Visit

YEAR FIVE

Review of all Profile Data, Progress and Program Analysis, Beginning of next Self-Study, revision of Schoolwide Action Plan

YEAR TWO

Profile Update, Refinement of Schoolwide Action Plan

YEAR THREE

Profile Update, Midterm (Midcycle) Progress Report or Midterm (Mid-cycle) Progress Report and one-day Review, Refinement of Schoolwide Action Plan

YEAR FOUR

Profile Update, Refinement of Schoolwide Action Plan

- The involvement and collaboration of stakeholders
- The clarification of the school's mission and Institutional Level Outcomes (ILOs)

The assessment of the student program and its impact on student learning with respect to the mission, ILOs, and WASC Criteria

The review and update of a schoolwide Action Plan

Accountability system for monitoring the implementation of the Action Plan

SCE's WASC History

February 2008: It all began!!!

April 2009: Initial three-year accreditation term

June 2012: Continuing Ed received a six-year accreditation

April 2015: Mid-cycle report and visit completed, and accreditation was reaffirmed through the end of six-year cycle

August 2016: Self-study process begins

May 2018: Accreditation reaffirmed for a six-year term

May 2021: Midcycle report submitted, and accreditation was reaffirmed through the end of six-year cycle

March 2022: Self-study process begins






