Course Description

This course is a historical survey of rock music from its beginnings in the early 1950s to the present. Rhythm & blues, rockabilly, the British Invasion, Motown, soul, folk rock, hard rock, punk, metal, and various alternative rock styles will be discussed. Personalities and musical styles will be related to the sociology of the time period being studied. This is an honors course designed to provide enriched experience. Students may not receive credit for both MUS 15 and MUS 15H.

se content will include, but not limited to: band instrumentation, recording labels, producers and managers, and the myriad of styles that have influenced rock as well as influence by rock, such as reggae, funk, hip-hop and rap.

Prerequisite: Acceptance into the Honors Program.

Course Objectives

Student learning outcomes (SLO) and course measurable objectives (CMO) include:

- Defining the musical characters such as form and instrumentation of various different rock styles;
- Synthesizing the different musical genres that came together to create rock music, including blues and country, and discussing the continuing influences of those styles on current musical genres;
- Evaluating the sociological trends as reflected in musical styles and song lyrics;
- Compare and contrast historical, cultural, and socio-political contexts of different musical genres.
