#### 2022 FCLT Services & Planning Survey Results

#### Who are the Survey Respondents?

Of the 257 respondents, 95% (244) are professors and only 5% (13) are staff or hourly employees. Of the 220 professors who reported their employment status, 143 work at Mt. SAC part-time and 77 work as full-time faculty. About 44% were in their first decade of work at Mt. SAC, 30% in their second decade, and 26% have worked at Mt. SAC for over two decades. Most responses came from our largest divisions. Every department in the three largest divisions was represented; nearly every department in all divisions had at least one respondent. Two-thirds reported using some FCLT services in the past year.






#### **SPOT Certification & Canvas Skills**

Two-thirds of respondents are certified as distance learning instructors. The sample reflects an expected increase from just under half in 2019. In 2022, an additional 20% report that they plan to become DL certified; the remaining 15% either do not plan to (10%) or do not work in a teaching role (5%). Estimations of Canvas skills also reflect an expected improvement, with over 90% self-assessing Canvas skills at "intermediate" or above. The number with no skills or basic skills in 2019 (18%) is now under 10% since the pandemic began, and the largest gains are those who report "Advanced" skills (from 28 % in 2019, 37% in 2021, and 54% in 2022).


#### Current SPOT/DL certification status




#### Current self-assessed Canvas Skills




2021 SPOT/DL certification status




2021 Self-assessed Canvas Skills

#### **FCLT Use in 2021/2022**

Of the 145 respondents who reported on their use of FCLT services in the 2021-2022 academic year, most reported using FCLT workshops, Office Hours or direct help once or twice each semester and most responses were grouped around this to be slightly less or more. Common uses were related to how to accomplish things in Canvas, help with settings or access that required administrative access, which might include crosslisting, adding or removing people from courses, setting up students with incompletes, or resetting dates. One-third sought course design assistance and one quarter help with SPOT or accessibility.




#### Which of these, if any, did FCLT help you with in 2021-2022?


#### **FCLT Self-paced Resources**

Respondents indicated how helpful several resources provided/maintained by FCLT were to them in 2021-2022. Overwhelmingly, these resources were seen as helpful or very helpful. The Canvas Faculty Center is the oldest and best established of these resources and received the highest ratings of very helpful, but most resources were 90% rated helpful or very helpful. Respondents selecting "not helpful" were varied, not single selections of the same person across multiple categories.




#### **FCLT Workshops & Services**









#### FCLT: Looking Ahead to 2022-2023 Academic Year


For the upcoming academic year, over 87% of respondents expressed that they are at least "likely" to seek out a professional development workshop offered by the FCLT. Over 40% answered "very likely." Around 2/3 of respondents expect to attend 2-3 FCLT workshops in the upcoming academic year; nearly 20% expect to attend more than 3 workshops in the next year. Most would prefer workshops that feature examples, demonstrations, and hands-on opportunities as a part of the curriculum. Top rated topics were specific how-to topics, Canvas tools and updates, student-friendly design, and accessibility.

Likelihood of seeking out FCLT workshops/professional learning opportunities in 2022/23?




How many FCLT workshops might you attend over the next academic year?



#### What do you most value in an FCLT workshop?








\*\*Drilling down on "student friendly design," what specific course elements do you want to learn?


^Drilling down, on "expanded uses of Canvas," did you have 1 specific advanced tool in mind for the selection?


#### **Workshop Preferences**

Live Zoom sessions are strongly preferred, followed by online self-paced/asynchronous options. Other options have minority support but serve fewer professors in their preferred format. Some people are looking forward to the return of in-person sessions. Fridays were the strong preference for scheduling live sessions, although other day selections should be read with caution due to a forced choice of 3 options for the first half of the survey duration. In terms of timing, summer workshops and training two weeks prior to major terms are widely preferred. Winter intersession was the third most preferred time. Most did not prefer sessions too close to the start of term, or at any time during major terms.

#### What workshop format do you prefer?




#### In general, which days work best for you to attend scheduled workshops?

Thinking about your upcoming semester, when are you most likely to attend a workshop or seek out training?




#### **FCLT Communications**

Currently, the POD emails have been very successful in advertising FCLT workshops and services. Using POD for important FCLT updates is a good idea. Collectively responses suggest that professors would really like the FCLT to engage them with short, weekly emails, rather than at longer intervals with more stylized or longer communications such as a newsletter, blog, or course announcements, or in passive mediums such as the portal, in global announcements, or by checking the POD calendar. The FCLT may take into account how to accomplish this while tracking interest and views, including how to integrate with our other diverse forms of communication (website, Canvas, blog, etc).


How do you typically find out about FCLT workshops, services, and resources? (0% toggled off - check final if they are nonzero values)

The only issue I have ever had is other participants. It's just like any classroom; some students take over discussion with too many questions, things that are best handled individually. I have found more sessions derailed by one participant who asked for too much individual help for things he or she barely tried to help themselves do. I wish the session leaders kept the whole group in mind when that happens. 15 people should not have to sit through one person's issues and rants.














