

PIE Brag Statement, Library Department

In late Spring Semester of 2020, the Library and Biology department faculty and management worked together to successfully secure two electronic resources for Biology students to ensure curriculum delivery by faculty who lost access to physical teaching materials and spaces due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Biology and Library faculty both attended vendor demonstration sessions and later met privately to discuss options (see attached slides). After deciding on which products best met student needs and presenting it to management, management went forward with a CARES Act Emergency Needs request which was approved by President Scroggins.

The two electronic resources secured were Acland Anatomy and Virtual Body with the former being subscription-based and the latter being perpetual access.

Both resources were made ready for Biology faculty and students by the Library's Electronic Resources Librarian in time for courses which moved to remote instruction. As of Spring 2022, the content of Acland Anatomy has had an astounding 200K+ interactions (see attached). Given the urgency of a solution for Biology students, this project is of special significance in the story of overcoming the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic and a good example of how departments work effectively across disciplines to make decisions that ensure student success.
