In accordance with Federal and State regulations, all students receiving federal and state financial aid are required to maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) in order to remain eligible to receive financial aid. Failure to meet the SAP standards described below will result in loss of federal and state financial aid with the exception of the California College Promise Grant. A student's SAP status will be evaluated at the conclusion of the Fall, Spring, and Summer terms. Students who are not meeting the SAP Standards described above will be placed under a Warning or Suspended status, dependent on whether they were previously in a Satisfactory or Warning status.
