Metrics Update Patricia Quinones June 22, 2022

BACKGROUND

The attached report was developed to provide an annual update to the Board of Trustees on key performance metrics with an equity focus that Mt. SAC monitors on a regular bases. Mt. SAC uses this data for planning purposes and to assess effectiveness of the campus's various programs and initiatives.

OVERVIEW

The key performance metrics reviewed for this update were: course success, persistence, completion of transfer-level English and/or math, completion of certificates and awards, and transferring to a four-year institution. The metrics will be used to both celebrate students' progress and offer opportunities for the College to improve upon its services to students.

This report includes a student equity focus to identify and foster awareness of equity gaps within key performance metrics with the ultimate purpose of assisting the College in achieving equitable student outcomes. The data reveals that Latinx, Black or African American, and students of color show lower course success rates and larger percentage point gaps when compared to their Asian and White counterparts. Asian, Black or African American, Latinx, and White students experienced a drop in course success rates between 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 as the impact of COVID-19 was felt. Yet, we have observed a rebound in source success rates in 2020-2021 for these four specific student groups. Fall to Spring persistence rates for credit course enrollment has declined every year between 2016-2017 to 2020-2021. Black or African American students demonstrate the lowest Fall to Spring persistence rates when compared to their Asian, Latinx, and White counterparts.

Beginning in 2018-2019 and every year thereafter, we see an increase in the percentage of students that completed transfer-level math and transfer-level English in their first year. We noticed the same trend for the completion of transfer math in the first year yet not for transfer English during this time frame. Asian students show the highest completion rates for Transfer English and/or math in year one followed by White, Latinx, and Black or African American students. Given that Latinx students make up nearly 63% of the total credit headcount, it is not surprising that Latinx students complete a higher number of degrees and certificates, followed by Asian, White, and Black or African American students. We observe a similar pattern in transfer numbers, where Latinx students also transfer in higher numbers followed by Asian, White, and Black or African American students.

SUMMARY

While Mt. SAC continues to support Black and African American and Latinx students, it is evident based on the data that we need to continue to expand our equity work.
