Recommendation on RSI

"Standard II.A.7 and Policy on Distance Education and Correspondence Education:

In order to meet the Standard(s), the Commission requires that the college ensure that regular and substantive interaction (RSI) takes place in distance education courses."



Follow-up Report

Written Response to identified RSI Compliance Requirements





- ✓ In Fall 2025, the ACCJC Team will review 50 randomly pulled asynchronous online courses that conclude in Spring 2025
- ✓ At lease 85% of the 50 courses must show compliance with the federal policy on RSI as outline in the ACCJC Rubric
- ✓ Margin for error: 7 courses
