A Knowledge is Power Learning Community (KPLC) was launched in Summer 2025 as a pilot with SPCH 1A (COMM C1000), centering Asian Pacific Islander voices in the course. Partnering with the Arise Program, the Living Museum was curated to showcase the students' work in this campus-wide event held July 15, 2025. Faculty Thuy Pham and Jedi Curva co-taught and created a phenomenal space where students felt seen, empowered, and uplifted. This is an AANHPI SAP Blueprint Project for "Culturally Responsive Learning Communities" in collaboration with the Communication Studies Department and Humanities and Social Sciences Division.

The Arise Academy is an AANHPI SAP collaborative project with our partners, Cal Poly Pomona (CPP). Just before Poly Transfer started, the Arise Academy kicked off a full day's program that included presentations on cultural identity and capital, AANHPI student resources, mentorship with AANHPI faculty across disciplines, and community building. This project is a blueprint for advising and counseling, transfer exploration, and mentorship engagement.

Asian Pacific American Heritage Month (APAHM) 2025 celebrated the rich fabrics of our diverse AANHPI students, staff, faculty, administrators, and community.

As part of Asian Pacific American Heritage Month (APAHM) 2025, the first annual Threads of Tradition showcased traditional and contemporary attire on the runway, representing China, Japan, Samoa, Philippines, Cook Islands, Tonga, Vietnam, India, Korea, Indonesia and Mynamar. Stories about the history, cultural significance, and symbolism were shared as a way to educate the over 150 attendees about the AANHPI community.
