9. AA-T Music PLOs for Approval.

The Outcomes Committee has suggested changes to the PLOs created or presented during the last department meeting. Their edited versions are below. Do we approve them?

- PLO 1: Performance. Students will rehearse, collaborate, and perform music across a wide range of compositional styles and in a variety of professional venues.
- PLO 2: Analysis and Composition. Students will be able to analyze and compose tonal music.
- PLO 3: Dictation and Sight Singing. Students will be able to dictate and sight sing tonal music.
- PLO 4: Keyboard Skills. Students will be able to sight read, transpose, and improvise music at the keyboard.
- PLO 5: History and Literature. Students will interpret and identify the cultural and historical contexts of music, as well as stylistic differences, in the Western classical traditions.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

- 1. The number of units for Women's Ensemble the department voted to reduce the number of units from 2 to 1.

- 3. Submit any ideas for 2015-16 faculty recital programs to Tiffany.
- 4. With Jeannie out, it was decided to ask for Liz Callahan to be present in the department on Monday through Thursday of Final Exam week to help with check in of practice room key cards and with paperwork for juries and FIG.
- 5. Vote for 2015-16 chair of music department Tiffany unanimously elected.
- 6. Sue joined the meeting to discuss the ongoing concern over the role of Music Department Secretary. Sue maintains that the position has never been Music Department Secretary, but always has been Arts Division Secretary. Bruce Rogers gave the history of the position, starting when he asked the President's Office for secretarial help, starting with part-time student to part-time non-student to full time secretary when Jeannie DeVito took the position. It started out to be just for the choral program, and then grew to cover the entire music department. Sue said that she was in on the creation of the position and again said that it was never a department position, but a division position. Even though it was pointed out that Fullerton College, Riverside City College and Citrus College all have dedicated music department secretaries, Sue said that no other single department at Mt. SAC has a department secretary and that the Music Department doesn't need one either. The question was asked if the position will be replaced when Jeannie DeVito eventually retires, Sue said that that was not a certainty, and if so, will be an Arts Division position and not a Music Department position.
