Dear Faculty,

In order to accommodate faculty preferences as well as meet criteria for program certification, we have made a few changes to our program options. Beginning this spring, we will still offer Supplemental Instruction (SI), but we will also pilot a new academic support option: Embedded Tutoring (ET). We will also continue to offer Study Groups (SGs).

We ask that ALL faculty who request one of our academic support options this spring take the time to review our [SI Program Faculty Guidelines](#). Our guidelines provide details on our three academic support options: SI, ET, and SGs.

Priority consideration will be given to faculty and prospective SIs/ETs/SG Tutors meeting the deadlines below. Late academic support assignments can be made if funding is available. Also considered for all academic support requests are student attendance history, SI/Tutor application process for new applicants, and SI/Tutor work history for returning SIs/Tutors.

You may refer new applicants to our [SI Application](#) or [Tutor Application](#). Both applications are also available in the ASAC. All applicants must meet the following criteria:

- A minimum 3.0 Overall GPA
- Completion of the course for which they are applying with a grade of A or B
- Good communication and interpersonal skills
- Additional qualifications as listed on applications
