

School of Continuing Education Fast Facts 2015-16

The Mt. SAC School of Continuing Education (SCE) is the 4th largest noncredit program in the California Community Colleges

- SCE was established in 1971
- In 2015-16 SCE generated 6,249 Full-Time Equivalent Student (FTES)
- SCE holds a dual accreditation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (ACCJC and ACS)
- SCE programs serve students across the lifespan including adult learners, minors, and senior citizens
- Noncredit courses are offered four terms per year (winter, spring, summer, fall) with weekend and evening options available
- SCE student support facilities include the Language Learning Center, Language Smart Lab, WIN student athlete support center, ABE Career Center, ESL Library, as well as multiple on-campus and off-campus computer labs (ABE, ESL, EOA)
- Classes are available on the Mt. SAC campus and at over 50 community-based sites such as schools, senior and community centers
- SCE counselors and educational advisors held 5,091 individual student appointments
- Fee-based classes and programs include Career and Professional Development, Personal Enrichment, Sports and Fitness, Children and Teens, and Online Learning
- Community Education (fee-based) and Contract Training served 6,830 students
- SCE is a member of the Mt. SAC Regional Consortium for Adult Education, along with 7 area school districts and 1 ROP, and is working to align, leverage and expand instructional and programmatic services to ensure adult learners transition to college and employment.
