Please Note:

- 1. Upper division transfer students (60-70 semester baccalaureate units) will need to have at least 30 semester units of general education. Within those 30 units, Area A (9) semester units and Mathematics (3) semester units must be completed with grades of "C-" or better.
- Courses on this list have been approved by the CSU Office of the Chancellor for Fall 2017 and beyond. If a course was completed prior to approval, it cannot be certified for CSU General Education Breadth requirements
- 3. Some majors at CSU do not allow double counting of major preparation courses and general education requirements. Students are advised to consult with a counselor or advisor to determine if courses can be double counted.
- 4. Some majors require specific general education courses. Students planning to transfer are advised to plan their schedules carefully in order to maintain progress.
