California College Promise Grant (Formerly Known As Board of Governors Fee Waiver) Appeal Information

Minimum requirements for maximum success

Whether you want to move into a career or move on to a four-year university, California community colleges want to help you achieve your educational goals. The California College Promise Grant (formerly known as BOG Fee Waiver) is available for eligible students at California community colleges, and will waive your per unit enrollment fee at any community college throughout the state.

Once you have qualified for the California College Promise Grant (CCPG), it is important to ensure that you are meeting the academic and progress standards in order to avoid losing the fee waiver.

Academic — Sustain a GPA of 2.0 or higher

If your cumulative GPA falls below 2.0 for two consecutive primary terms (fall/spring semesters, or fall/winter/spring quarters), you may lose your fee waiver eligibility.

Progress — Complete more than 50% of your coursework

If the cumulative number of units you completed is not more than 50% in two consecutive primary terms (fall/spring semesters, or fall/winter/spring semesters), you may lose your fee waiver eligibility.

Combination of Academic and Progress Standards

Any combination of two consecutive terms of cumulative GPA below 2.0, and/or cumulative unit completion of not more than 50% may result in loss of fee waiver eligibility.

How will I know? You will be notified within 30 days of the end of each term if you are being placed on either Academic (GPA) and/or Progress (Course Completion) probation. Your notification will include the information that a second term of probation will result in loss of fee waiver eligibility. After the second consecutive term of probation, you may lose eligibility for the fee waiver at your next registration opportunity.

How to regain eligibility. If you lose eligibility for the California College Promise Grant, there are a few ways that you can have it reinstated:

- Improve your GPA or Course Completion measures to meet the academic and progress standards
- Successful appeal regarding extenuating circumstances
- Not attending your school district for two consecutive primary terms (fall/spring semesters, or fall/winter/spring semesters)

The appeals process for extenuating circumstances includes:

- Verified accidents, illness or other circumstances beyond your control
- Changes in economic situation
- Evidence of inability to obtain essential support services
- Disability accommodations not received in a timely manner
- Special consideration factors for CalWORKs, EOPS, ACCESS, and Veteran Students

CCPG Appeal Processing Instructions

- Complete the student information part of this appeal form, select ONE reinstatement circumstance, sign and date the form. Prepare a typed narrative/description of your situation and schedule an appointment with an Educational Counselor or Educational Advisor. When making an appointment with a Counselor or Advisor, let the scheduler know you are requesting a comprehensive education plan or will be updating your current education plan. NOTE: Counseling/Advising appointments may take from 10 days - 2 weeks to schedule.
- Bring this form and narrative with you to your Counseling/Advising appointment. If you are a CalWORKs, EOPS, ACCESS, or Veteran student, it is highly recommended that you meet with the appropriate program Counselor.
- 3. If you are requesting an appeal for Academic/Progress probation due to "Extenuating Circumstances" such as verified illness, accident or circumstances beyond your control, or documented changes in your economic situation, have your supporting documentation ready. (Supporting documentation are doctor's notes, accident report, loss of job, etc.) Do not submit your originals; attach copies to your appeal form.
- 4. Submit the completed Appeal form to the Financial Aid Office with all of the supporting documentation that is indicated on the form based on your appeal reason (Appeal Form, typed description, comprehensive education plan, and supporting documentation). Any missing information will result in your Enrollment Priority/California College Promise Grant Appeal form being rejected by the Appeals Committee.
- Check your Financial Aid Tab for a decision. Appeals
 are processed in date order and decisions are posted
 in approximately two weeks.
