





### How to Meet Eligibility for Promise+Plus 2021-2022



1 FIRST-TIME COLLEGE STUDENT

Be a first-time college student that has never attended any US college \*dual enrollment and concurrent enrollment high school students exempt

2 RESIDENT OR AB540 ELIGIBLE

Must be a California resident or be AB540 eligible

2021-22 FAFSA OR CA DREAM ACT Apply for Financial Aid each academic year (2021-22 FAFSA or California Dream Act). Student does not need to qualify for Financial Aid, but does need to apply.

4 SELECT A MAJOR

Select a major of study \*certificates under 16 units and undecided major students are not eligible for CA Promise Programs














### What is EOPS/CARE



- Extended Opportunity Programs and Services
  - A California community college state-funded program
  - Provides access to educational opportunities (history: Civil Rights Act)
  - Supports eligible underrepresented students along educational journey
  - A program that has been advocating for students for more than 50 years!
- Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE)
  - The CARE Program promotes the academic success of EOPS students who are single heads of household and receiving TANF/CalWORKs assistance (cash aid) or Tribal TANF with at least one dependent child under the age of 18.

### EOPS/CARE



### **EOPS/CARE** is currently accepting applications

### •Eligibility Criteria:

- 1) Qualify for the California College Promise Grant (under method A, B or C with an EFC of \$0.)
- 2) Must enroll in 12 units (ACCESS or Foster Youth only need to enroll in 9 units)

### •Some Program Benefits:

- 1) Priority Registration
- 2) EOPS Book Service (\$300)
- 3) One-on-one tutoring services (currently online)
- 4) Counseling Services


