<p>4. California State University Chancellor's Revised Executive Order 1100 Related to Courses Delivered by Distance Education Modalities</p>	<p>Meghan shared with the group a recent document from the Chancellor's Office about CSU's acceptance of public speaking and lab science courses offered online. For a few years, there was a credible rumor that CSUs will not accept online public speaking or science lab courses. This missive is countering that rumor by citing the CSU Chancellor's Office's Executive Order for CSU to accept those online courses, and the Order cites specific Ed Code, which prohibits any institution to not accept those courses based on online modality.</p> <p>See excerpt below:</p> <p><i>"3.2 Instructional Modality GE requirements may be satisfied through courses taught in all modalities (e.g., face-to-face, hybrid, or completely online). Pursuant to California Education Code Section 66763, an online course shall be accepted for credit at the student's home campus on the same basis as it would be for a student matriculated at the host campus."</i></p> <p>This means that CSU will not reject a course exclusively because it is taught via distance education. This is an important distinction because Executive Order 1100, section 3.2 makes it clear oral communication and lab science courses taught via distance education are accepted for CSU GE Breath effective August 23, 2017.</p>
<p>5. Discussion on having vendors for content/video authoring tools such as SoftChalk and Kaltura to help with PIE request from FCLT/DL.</p> <p>What is SoftChalk? SoftChalk Cloud includes our powerful content authoring tool that makes it super-easy for educators to create interactive, engaging, lesson content for their online courses. Use SoftChalk Create to develop custom course materials that work in any LMS and can be viewed by students on any device.</p> <p>What is Kaltura? Kaltura is a web-based application that allows groups to create, edit, and share videos.</p>	<p>DLC agrees that having a vendor presentation would be a good use of time at our final DLC meeting of the year.</p> <p>IIA. and IIIC.</p>
