Grading Method: Pass/No Pass – J. Fowler Cont	On one hand, faculty want to give students the opportunity to take General Education (GE) courses outside of their major without jeopardizing their GPA with the intention that they may discover other areas of interest. On the other hand, faculty should be more intentional when reviewing courses and selecting grading options to align to our policy. How will Pass/No pass grading impact ADTs? Jamaika is still researching this issue with other colleges. Jamaika suggested faculty should present rationale as to why they are choosing the Pass/No pass grading option. A field for rationale should be placed in the course outline of records. Jamaika presented a revised AP 4232. Instruction Office will send a list of Pass/No pass courses to departments. Faculty should to confirm that they intentionally want Pass/No pass grading option.  AP 4232 will be brought back next week for further discussion.
