INFORMATION – FEE BASED COURSES FOR WINTER

1. THE FOLLOWING COURSES/PROGRAMS WILL BE OFFERED THROUGH THE CONTINUING EDUCATION DIVISION AS FEE PROGRAMS BEGINNING IN THE WINTER SEMESTER. THEY WILL BE GOING TO THE NOVEMBER OR DECEMBER MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR APPROVAL: COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY (CT) REGISTRY EXAM (NOVEMBER), CODING: ICD 10 CM (NOVEMBER), CODING: UPDATE FOR ICD-9 TO ICD-10 (NOVEMBER)
2. THE LIST OF COURSES WITH DUE DATES FOR 4-YEAR REVIEW IS ATTACHED. THE 4-YEAR REVIEW DATE IS BASED ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE, NOT THE COURSE APPROVAL DATE (AS PER C&I). FACULTY ARE ENCOURAGED TO SUBMIT 4-YEAR REVIEW OF COURSES BY MAY 31 IN CASE PROPOSED CHANGES INCLUDE A MODIFICATION.

CONSENT AGENDA: - LCOM 80, 90, AND 100 – 4 –YEAR REVIEW AND DISCIPLINE PLACEMENT

THE ACADEMIC SENATE RETURNED LCOM 80, 90, AND 100 TO EDC TO AFFIRM THAT THE COURSES WERE 4-YEAR REVIEW AND NOT MODIFICATIONS, AND TO CONSIDER OVERLAP WITH COUNSELING COURSES. EDC HAS REAFFIRMED THAT LCOM 80, 90, AND 100 FOLLOWED THE 4-YEAR REVIEW PROCESS AND NO COURSE CHANGES TRIGGERED A COURSE MODIFICATIONS. FURTHER, EDC CONCLUDED THAT THERE IS NO EXISTING OVERLAP OF LCOM 80, 90, AND 100 WITH EXISTING COUNSELING COURSES. AFTER DISCUSSION, EDC RECOMMENDS THAT LCOM 80, 90, AND 100 BE PLACED IN THE COUNSELING DISCIPLINE (ALONG WITH THE LEARNING ASSISTANCE DISCIPLINE) AT THE REQUEST OF THE LEARNING ASSISTANCE DEPARTMENT.

ACTION – NEW DEGREES

AS-T ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE: PROGRAM TYPE: ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE FOR TRANSFER (REQUIRED UNITS IN THE MAJOR: 18)

THE ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE IN ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE FOR TRANSFER PROVIDES A BROAD BASE OF EDUCATION IN THE DISCIPLINE. STUDENTS WILL ACQUIRE THE ABILITY TO IDENTIFY AND APPLY LEGAL PRECEDENTS IN FIELD WORK, BE PREPARED TO UNDERSTAND THE USE OF CRIMINAL CODES IN THE INVESTIGATION AND DOCUMENTATION OF CRIME, AND BECOME FAMILIARIZED WITH THE SOCIAL FACTORS THAT INVOLVE POLICE INTERACTION WITHIN THE COMMUNITY. THE DEGREE WILL SUPPORT STUDENTS INTERESTED IN BRANCHING OUT INTO UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES IN THE SOCIAL SCIENCES.

TO EARN AN ASSOCIATE DEGREE FOR TRANSFER, A STUDENT MUST COMPLETE 60 SEMESTER UNITS THAT ARE ELIGIBLE FOR TRANSFER TO CSU THAT CONSIST OF: IGETC PATTERN OR CSU GE BREADTH AND A MAJOR OF AT LEAST 18 UNITS. STUDENTS MUST HAVE A MINIMUM GPA OF 2.0 IN ALL CSU-TRANSFERABLE COURSEWORK TO RECEIVE AN ASSOCIATE DEGREE FOR TRANSFER AND ALL COURSES IN THE MAJOR MUST BE COMPLETED WITH A C OR BETTER. STUDENTS EARNING AN ASSOCIATE DEGREE FOR TRANSFER WILL NOT BE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE ANY OTHER LOCAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS.
