SAC's support of "Gender and Ethnic Studies at Mt. SAC". He made reference to an attached student petition in support Gender/Ethnic Studies. To date, he mentioned 250 students had signed the petition. He also handed out an ICC flyer, Organizing for Change, and additional workshops included in a 05/20/16 event. Don suggested that the creation of a list of the courses in one section of the class schedule would help to create awareness of what is currently offered.	
7.0	WorkForce Preparedness Conference – Ana Tafoya-Diaz	WorkForce Preparedness Conference is supported by Student Equity which included SEED, CalWORKs and CARE participants. The Career & Transfer Services program will follow up with similar events in the future and assume the lead role. There were about 85 students who attended this event which emphasized 'soft skills for
