SAC faculty advisor for the Native American students and club; active with the Native American community; completed research on Native American attitudes towards higher education. Jaime Rocha is a journalism student; identifies as Tongva-Gabrielino who are indigenous people of the Los Angeles Basin and Orange County; her grandmother was Chief Vera "Ya'anna" Rocha; her father is Nick Rocha who is currently on the cultural advisory board for Anahuacalmecac International Baccalaureate World School in Los Angeles; the family has	The committee members agree to form a sub-group; initial meeting with Bruce Nixon and Frances Borella; the subgroup will meet and discuss specific items; report back at the next SEC

been involved with native activism and politics, especially her grandmother.

Gilbert Marquez a former Mt. SAC student; in 2017-2019 he served as the community college coordinator for the American Indian recruitment, a student lead initiative in UCLA, which allowed for developing relationships within the community during cultural events all over central and southern California; understands the educational pipeline; the emphasis on recruitment is crucial in developing long term functioning programs.

Julián Angél Ibañez Mandujano is currently a Mt. SAC student; identifies as Yoeme/Yaqui; has experience networking with multiple Native Americans throughout southern California and parts of the southwest areas; volunteers in Pomona discussing ethnic studies; is an active voice for 2 years at Mt. SAC with the purpose to not overlook their population and will continue to contribute as an advocate.

Eric Lara explained about 1 year ago, VPSS Audrey Yamagata-Noji assigned the Student Equity Committee to take over the Native American Student initiative to do further research, collect student data; enrollment numbers; the committee wants to hear more from students with their input and have insights on moving in the right direction.

Jaime Rodriguez shared the data and findings related to the annual headcount for American Indian / Alaska Native, Multi-Ethnicity, and Pacific Islander students between 2004/2005 – 2018/2019; he explained a shift occurred in 2009-2010 and that multi-ethnicity numbers went up which means it's aggregated numbers; these are preliminary findings and it's still in working progress to really understand the true numbers.

Concerns and Discussions:

Native American students feel that they are invisible, not important, and fearful identifying as Native American on campus; some students feel confused with their identity; campus visibility or a place Native American students can have a location to find one another is essential such as a Native Center; supporting Native students with organized meetings to discuss and find ceremonies to feel connected as a Native American; make available Native American Study Programs and transfer degrees for Native Studies; hiring Native faculty is essential; curriculum for Native American Studies transfer

		degree; Increase space and visibility so students can further develop their academic career, emphasize the family connection, provide interconnected mentorship, and promote sending culture community college to a receiving culture college; have a holistic approach to address the student needs and transfer expectations. Student Life started the process and submitted a board policy to recite the Land Acknowledgement at every event as part of an opening session. This past summer, the Chancellor's Office approved Social Justice Studies program; the emphasis on Native American Studies curriculum is in working progress.	
		Racial Justice Task Force forwarded recommendations; an equity audit of the hiring process will be reviewed thoroughly; specifically in relation to people of color and minorities; required implicit bias training for all members of the hiring committee; a new improved EEO training as well; incentive for members of the search and selection committees; examine the culture of excellence at Mt. SAC.
