Completed report will be shared with the GPS committee and senate at the beginning of the year. S. Blacksher, M. Chen, and K. Fowler met with P. Romero regarding the budget status and it's looking good. The goal of the meeting to make sure that as we come into the closing out GPS and do a health check. Managers that have staff on the grant need to be notified that after spring of next year, that part of the grant will close. The budget for years 1-3 has been spent. There is a little money left from year 4. This leaves us with year 5 money and if we spend that the way we have, then we should have approximately \$300k and we will not have to return those funds. Year 5 money will be front loaded. What could change is that we get minigrants and that money can be spent. Moving forward, we will not have money to manage staff positions and LHE being used up until this point.
